HASSELBACK **CHICKEN & STRAWBERRY** SPINACH SALAD

Cook 1/4 cup of fresh spinach on medium heat in a splash of oil for 3 to 5 minutes until it is slightly wilted.

Stir in **1/4 cup of ricotta cheese** and cook for a further 30 to 60 seconds. Allow to cool. Cut slits in two chicken breasts about 1/2 inch apart but don't cut all the way through - about 75% of the way through is what you should aim for.

Stuff all the spinach and ricotta mixture into slits. Season the chicken with salt and pepper to taste. Grate 1/4 cup cheddar cheese and sprinkle over the breasts generously. Shake 1 tsp of ground paprika over the chicken to add flavour and colour. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes in 400°F oven until the cheese has melted and the juices are clear. Enjoy with a Strawberry Spinach Salad.

In a bowl whisk together equal amounts of dijon mustard, extravirgin olive oil, apple cider vinegar or fresh lemon juice, honey, garlic clove and salt and pepper.

Adjust to taste. Refrigerate until ready to use. Soak the thinly sliced red onion in very cold water for up to 15 minutes then drain and pat dry. Prepare **baby spinach, chopped** fresh strawberries, chopped raw pecans or **walnuts and crumbled feta cheese**. Mix together with dressing. As this is a salad, there are no measurements and adjusted according to personal taste. Enjoy!


and shipped off to developing countries. Keeping all these items out of our landfill sites is an environmentally successful endeavour, especially when these items are being used in such worthwhile ways.

Winter Gardening

At our July meeting, Hélène Hébert spoke to us about winter gardening. She is an engineer who loves to garden. She spent 2 1/2 years in the arctic

where she began to develop this style of gardening. Her husband bought her a book called THE MARKET GARDENER by Jean-Martin Fortier and she says it completely changed her life. Now Hélène plants every week and doesn't fight with bugs or animals. Hélène started an indigenous company while in the north and is still the treasurer. She creates wide berths separated by paths and plants a variety of fruits and vegetables next to each other. In the winter, she will install 'hoops'

over the individual rows and covers them with a tarp to create tunnels in

which the plants continue to grow. Hélène showed us a video of her family harvesting carrots from the

garden in January. Just knock the snow off and you're ready to go. Hélène's garden rotates throughout the seasons but she sticks to root vegetables, herbs and surprisingly - leafy vegetables throughout the winter months. Hélène uses natural bug repellants like marigolds. They keep the bugs away and they are edible. Hélène recommends the leaves in your salads.
