TURKEY CROQUETTES

New Year's is always a time of resolutions and the first resolution, especially after indulging over Christmas, is to start eating healthily. This is a classic recipe to use up leftover turkey. Pair this with a

salad and you are off to a great start to the new year!

In a sauté pan over medium heat, melt **2 tablespoons of butter**. Add **1/2 cup of chopped onion** and **1/2 cup of chopped celery** and partially cover the pan. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the vegetables are soft and translucent, 3 to 4 minutes. Add **1 teaspoon of fresh sage** and **season with salt and pepper to taste**. Remove the vegetables from the heat and stir in **1 cup chopped cooked turkey**. Let cool to room temperature.

In a shallow bowl, combine **2 eggs** and **3 tablespoons of milk**. Whisk to blend. Place **1 cup of flour** and **2 cups of bread crumbs** in separate shallow bowls. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

In another bowl, combine **2 cups of cold mashed potatoes**, **1 egg** and **2 tablespoons of flour**. Fold until blended. Have a bowl of cold water nearby. Get your hands wet but not dripping with water. Place about 2 tablespoons of mashed potato mixture and form into a ball, sealing the turkey mixture in the centre. Roll the ball in the flour, then the egg mixture and finally the bread crumbs. Set the croquette on the prepared baking sheet. Repeat.

In a deep-fry pan over medium-heat in an oil depth of 2 to 3 inches, carefully place 3 or 4 croquettes in the hot oil (do not crowd the pan) and cook, turning as needed, until golden brown, 3 to 4 minutes. Repeat with the remaining croquettes. Serve hot with gravy.

Yield: 12 to 15 croquettes.

Eva Hammond

Profile on Eva Hammond

This is a new addition to The Julip. Each month we will profile a different member of our club. Who better to start with than one of our founding members.

Eva Hammond has an excellent memory which, she points out, is from friends and family calling her and having to recognize them by their phone numbers that come up on her display.

In so many questions, Eva would turn the spotlight on her husband, Russ Hammond, quite clearly the love of her life.

Eva was born in Moncton and after high school moved to Montreal and attended the Royal Victoria Nursing School and received her registered nurse's certificate. She took additional courses in neurology and worked in the Neurological Institute eventually as Head Nurse working with Dr

Cohn and Dr Penfield. In the 1970s, Eva was now married with four children and living in the Mont St-Hilaire area on the south shore of Montreal. She had given up her position as Head Nurse and was now working as Community Health Nurse for the South Shore Protestant School Board. She saved her earnings from this position to put herself through McGill to attain a Bachelor of Nursing.

In 1974, during the FLQ Crisis in Montreal, Bell Telephone moved its International Division to Ottawa. The Ottawa market was flooded with nurses and teachers because of this move and Eva, not one to take it lying down, decided to go after her real estate licence. Eva began working for Royal LePage. She was then offered the position of managing two offices in New Brunswick, Moncton and Miramichi. While in Moncton, Eva was approached to join Rotary. It was the late 1980s and Rotary wanted to move with the times and start admitting women into their club. Certainly, a firebrand like Eva was going to be an asset to any club. Eva was the first female Rotarian in Moncton but within the year many other women joined. It was while they were living in Moncton that Russ was approached to start a Probus club in Moncton. Russ had retired from Bell Telephone in 1989 while Eva continued to work for Royal LePage. Rotarian, Stan Steeves, met with Russ for coffee and the rest, as they say, was history. Russ began and ran the largest Probus club in Canada. The Moncton club had between 300 and 400 male members.

Eventually, Eva retired and they moved back to the Ottawa area, Manotick specifically. Russ missed his Probus club and Eva went to work speaking to Burritt Collins and Julius Frank of Rotary to secure the money necessary to start another Probus club. In 1994, the Probus Club of Ottawa Rideau Valley was established. Russ insisted that this club be a mixed club giving Eva the opportunity to join along with him and they became founding members.

When Eva and Russ moved closer to Ottawa, they started another Probus club, the Probus Club of Ottawa Alta Vista. They had twenty initial members who all began meeting in September of 1999. The club was officially registered with Probus Canada in 2000 and in that year, twenty more members joined. Russ acted in an advisory capacity for other Probus clubs, the Perth and Kanata clubs.

To stimulate the mind with excellent speakers and to widen a circle of friendships at a time in life when both these things might be diminishing. A phrase often used by Russ Hammond to describe Probus clubs.

In her younger years, Eva entered and won the Mrs Chatelaine contest for 1967, Canada's Centennial Year. This led to public speaking engagements. Eva's hobbies include painting, singing, skiing and snowshoeing. Eva still paints and loves to paint representational landscapes. Up until the start of Covid-19, she still studied voice. While in Montreal, Eva and Russ sang in Westmount Baptist Church choir under the direction of Galt MacDermot. If that name sounds familiar, it is because Mr MacDermot was the writer of the highly successful Broadway play HAIR.

Eva has lived in three provinces, married and widowed, raised a family of three sons and a daughter, was Head Nurse at the Neurological Institute in Montreal, earned her Bachelor of Nursing at McGill University, earned her real estate licence and was a founding member in two Probus clubs. That is our Eva Hammond.


